

Take home messages





The literature tell us...

Advanced RTTs supported by advanced education and professional experience practice at high level of **autonomy** and **complexicity.**

The evidence supports AP roles in **Neuro-oncology**.

Dedicated **Palliative AP roles** are becoming more prevalent amongst RTTs.



The survey data show us...

Is urgent to support & regulate this level of practice to protect **patients** & **professionals**!

Palliative AP roles are the most reported clinical area apart from tumour site-specific roles.

The **4 AP pillars** should be included in the educational programmes.

An advanced RTT should work across all 4 pillars!



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


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
